Fly the Stars and Stripes to Honor America's Veterans

FMAA Encourages Citizens to Observe Veterans Day

(Wayne, PA, November 3, 2015) . . . Wednesday, November 11 is Veterans Day – a day to pay tribute to America's veterans for their patriotism and willingness to serve and sacrifice in order to give our country a legacy of freedom and peace. The Flag Manufacturers Association of America (FMAA) is encouraging all citizens to fly the American flag as part of their observance of this holiday, in honor of our country's past and present armed forces members.

According to the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, an act approved May 13, 1938 made November 11 of each year a legal holiday known as "Armistice Day." Since the holiday was primarily established to honor veterans of World War I, the act was amended in 1954 following World War II to honor American veterans of all wars. With the approval of this legislation on June 1, 1954, November 11 officially became known as "Veterans Day."

Each year, the President of the United States issues a proclamation in the days leading up to November 11, requesting that government officials and citizens observe the day appropriately. Last year's proclamation stated that, ". . . we reflect upon the invaluable contributions of our country's veterans and reaffirm our commitment to provide them and their families with the essential support they were promised and have earned . . . our veterans . . . have risked their lives to defend our freedom. This selflessness binds our fates with theirs, and recognizing those who were willing to give their last full measure of devotion for us is a debt of honor for every American . . ."

One way to recognize our veterans and show support is by flying the American flag. "While we are forever grateful to our country's armed forces members, on Veterans Day especially we reflect on their service, sacrifice, and vital role in making our nation what it is today," commented Reggie VandenBosch, FMAA President. "Flying the American flag may seem like a small gesture, but it carries significant weight for anyone who has risked their life to protect this country."

The FMAA wants to ensure that the flags we proudly display on Veterans Day are true symbols of patriotism by encouraging Americans to look for the FMAA Certification Seal. United States

law requires every flag be labeled with its “country of origin.” Those designated as “Made in USA” may be true to their name, but only those bearing the FMAA Certification seal are guaranteed to adhere to the standards and continued compliance as monitored by a professional association and its domestic members. Look for the FMAA Certification Seal to be sure it is truly an American made flag.

In 2005, FMAA launched its “Certified Made in the USA” certification program, designed to ensure that all American flags purchased are made in the U.S. of materials that are domestic in origin and that all processes involved in its manufacture were completed in U.S. facilities with U.S. labor. The FMAA monitors and requires re-certification from its member manufacturers every year.
